Bringing together discipleship training, kids outreach and the local church for long-term kingdom impact



teve Meeker is passionate about growing roots. Specifically, the roots of disciples. As the Director of Leadership Lab International, the multicultural training arm of Scripture Union International that trains disciple makers and ministry teams, he has spent nearly three decades nurturing and guiding young Christian leaders from around the world so that they are equipped to do ministry for the rest of their lives.

It's work that centers connection: first with God, then with others.

And that focus on connection is what makes him most excited for Leadership Lab International's next opportunity: joining their mentored, experiential program for young disciple makers called *Transform* with the Scripture Union-designed *SuperKids*® outreach program and a local congregation, Calvary Church of Santa Ana, which has English and Spanish speaking congregations in Santa Ana, California.

Transform | A multicultural discipleship program from Scripture Union International's Leadership Lab International

Leadership Lab International (LLI)'s *Transform* program got its name from the fruit it produced. "Mentors of the participants kept coming back saying, 'This person has been transformed," LLI's director Steve Meeker says.

The program, which began in 2014, leads cohorts of up to 14 young adults from around the world through experiential ministry, equipped with mentors and time for reflection.

"Often leaders are thrust into leadership, and they don't have that environment where it's mentored," Steve explains. "We are intentional in getting *Transform* participants to retreat spiritually and find those places in life where they can rest and be refreshed with their walks with God."

For the first time, in the summer of 2023, *Transform* will offer training in Santa Ana, California, where participants will be trained in and lead a VBS-style *SuperKids* outreach in collaboration with Calvary Church of Santa Ana.

Steve explained that Transform participants, who are between ages 20-28, will gather in Santa Ana, California, to receive training in the *SuperKids* outreach program and Scripture Union USA's curriculum *Who is Jesus?*, while simultaneously being mentored and discipled. They'll then work with Calvary Church—which is gathering multigenerational support for the outreach, from high school student leaders to adults providing meals and housing for participants—to carry out the VBS-style outreach in the park.

But it won't stop there.

In preparation for this outreach—the first of its kind on the West Coast—the Who is Jesus? curriculum is being translated into Spanish. After that translation is complete, students from Calvary Church will use that curriculum for an outreach in Ensenada, Mexico, and Scripture Union Latin America will be able to use the materials throughout the Spanish speaking world.

The potential for ministry to expand and multiply abounds, from *Transform* participants returning to their home churches around the world with a new ministry model, to connections and relationships forged by the local church with their neighborhood, and a Spanish curriculum that can open doors for ministry in new regions. But Steve knows that is the beauty of connected ministry: the tall trees of the kingdom grow from the deep roots of discipleship.

Scripture Union's Who is Jesus? curriculum will launch in Spanish this summer at a VBS-style SuperKids outreach in Santa Ana, California, followed by a second outreach in Ensanadas, Mexico.

The interactive curriculum introduces detectives Shorty Sherlock and Wallaby Watson, who challenge children to use their detective skills to explore the Gospel of John and answer the question: Who is Jesus?

Teams across the country have used this curriculum in English to share the gospel through dramas and small group activities. The launch in Spanish will not only open ministry opportunities in the United States, but throughout the Spanish speaking world, with Scripture Union teams in Latin America partnering to share the curriculum as part of their outreach.

A 'level playing field' for floorball and faith in Ecuador

Helping young people to enjoy sport and have the chance to learn about faith on "a level playing field" is how Scripture Union Ecuador is reaching out in partnership with the Christian Floorball League.

National Director of SU Ecuador, Amy Carlson, said the floorball league was creating opportunities for them to reach out to local young people and their families.

"The beauty of this open-air sport is that we utilize the neighborhood playing field, and as such, there is a link with the community, rather than being linked to a religious building," Amy said.

She said floorball was a sport that is easy to pick up and join in. "In a culture predominantly dominated by football, this brings the youth to a level playing field, as one's prowess or reputation as a soccer player has little to do with their ability in this sport with stick and ball. Those typically on the side-lines of a football field can find a new opportunity to participate on the floorball court."

Amy explained that it was the same with faith, "Similarly, during the devotions and prayer time at every get-together, practice time, Saturday morning scrimmage, or league event, our youth and adults alike discover that we are on level ground at the foot of the Cross, where Jesus beckons each of us, regardless of skill or reputation, past performance or apparent potential, to lay our sins at his feet, accept his righteousness, and enter into fellowship with the Father through study of his Word, prayer, and discipleship."

One of the floorball players, Bryan talked about what being part of the floorball league had meant to him. He said, "I have been practicing Floorball for quite a while. During this time, I have been able to change a lot. Especially in my character, learning about God. Reading the Bible has allowed me to obtain a bit more wisdom and maturity. Mental maturity has enabled me to make better decisions regarding my life"
